**SONGWRITERS FOR STREAMS RETURNS APRIL 26
ALONG THE HARPETH RIVER**

Annual Earth Month event combines live music and conservation

WHAT:

Harpeth Conservancy will host its annual *Songwriters for Streams* event, an outdoor concert celebrating the connection between music and mission. Hosted by Libby and Nick Sieveking at their farm along the Harpeth River, the event brings together acclaimed songwriters and the community to support protection of clean water and rivers across Tennessee.

WHO:

- **Beth Nielsen Chapman**- Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame inductee and Grammy-nominated songwriter whose deeply personal, emotionally resonant catalog has shaped contemporary Americana and country music. Chapman has written hits recorded by artists such as Faith Hill, Martina McBride, and Willie Nelson, and continues to tour internationally with her acclaimed performances.
- **Hadlie Jo**- Louisiana-born and Texas-raised artist/writer, Hadlie Jo is forging her own path with songs rooted in traditional country music with a contemporary feel. She lent her introspective, story-driven lyrics to collaborator Vince Gill's recent release, "Nothing Like They Used To Be," and to her current single "Things," an homage to nostalgia and loss. At only 18 years old, Hadlie Jo is a rising voice in the next generation of country artists building her audience through local and regional performances at the Grand Ole Opry, The Bluebird Cafe and The Listening Room along with emerging releases that highlight her distinctive style.
- **Will Davis & The Wily Band**- Nashville-based Americana and country singer-songwriter blending roots instrumentation with modern storytelling, delivering high-energy live performances across the Southeast. The Wily Band, led by Will Davis, has gained recognition for its dynamic stage presence and original music rooted in Southern tradition.
